CURBSIDE CART & DROP SITE FRIENDLY ITEMS

CARDBOARD & PAPERBOARD

Flatten, remove plastic & foam.
Tape & Labels OK.



CARTONS

Coated paperboard that held liquid. **Rinse & keep cap on.**



GLASS BOTTLES & JARS

Clean & empty. Labels OK. **Remove metal lids.**



PLASTIC BOTTLES, JUGS & TUBS

Rigid plastics only. NO FOAM. Labels OK.
#1-7. Rinse & keep cap on.



PAPER, MAGAZINES, & NEWSPAPER

Remove plastic & rubber bands.
No shredded paper



METAL CANS & FOIL

CLEAN & empty. Labels OK.
Aerosol cans MUST be empty!



NOT ACCEPTED:

Plastic bags, shredded paper, cords/cables/wires, electronics, hazardous materials, windows, gift wrap, Styrofoam, clothing

Curbside Recycling

City of Wayland residents are eligible for curbside recycling service. Sign up by contacting Allegan County Resource Recovery at (269) 686-4559 or at City Hall.

Please obey the guidelines!

Contaminated recycling ends up in landfills and increases overall recycling costs.

- 
- 1. Rinse All Containers.**
 - 2. Leave caps on containers.**
 - 3. Break down cardboard boxes.**
 - 4. Check for recycling symbol and number on plastic material.**
 - 5. Respect recycling station and property.**
 - 6. Follow all guidelines.**

- 
- 1. Place items with any food or soiled material in recycling container.**
 - 2. No Hazardous Waste in recycling. (engine oil, pesticide, paint, etc.)**
 - 3. Place any large plastic items in recycling. (plastic lawn chairs, five gallon bucket, etc.).**
 - 4. No Clothes.**
- NO STYROFOAM!**

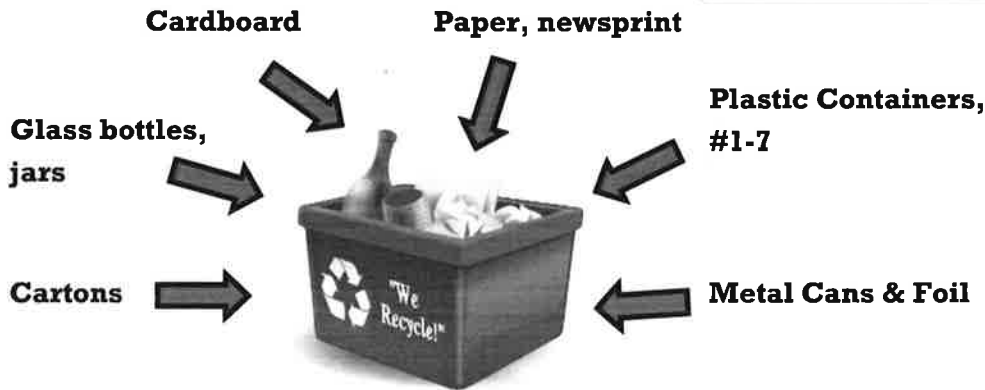

Resource Recovery will host a collection event at Harding's in Wayland on May 2th, 2020 to collect electronics (TVs and Computers) and Household Hazardous Waste.

Scrap Tire collections will be held throughout the year.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW):

Batteries, oil based paints, pesticides, solvents, fluorescent bulbs, cleaners, sharps and other chemicals can be dropped off by appointment at the Health Department. Call (269) 686-4559.

Battery Recycling Information:

A battery bucket is located at City Hall. No auto batteries. Broken Arrow Recycling (1100 Lincoln Rd) pays residents for their auto batteries and for scrap metal.

Resource Recovery Cards will not be issued this year. **City of Wayland residents no longer have access to Resource Recovery recycling depot sites.** Please contact City Hall and visit www.allegancounty.org for alternative collection information including recycling collection events hosted throughout the year.
